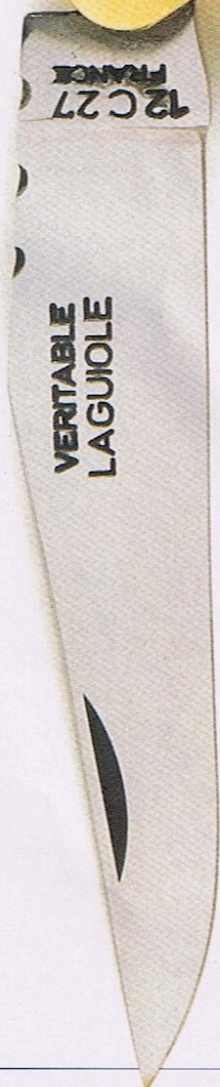

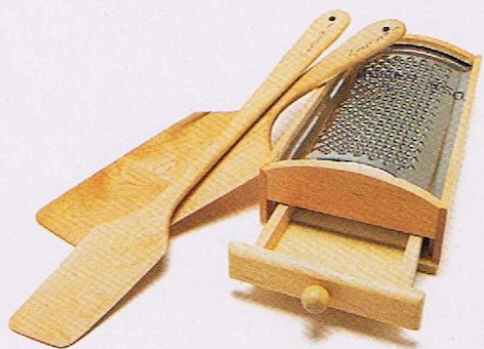
< The deepest cut
